Jackie Robinson was the first African-American to play major league baseball. While breaking baseball's color barrier, he faced jeering crowds in almost every stadium. While playing one day in his home stadium in Brooklyn, he committed an error. His own fans began to ridicule him. He stood at second base, humiliated, while the fans jeered. Then shortstop "Pee Wee" Reese came over and stood next to him. He put his arm around Jackie Robinson and faced the crowd. The fans grew quiet. Robinson later said that Reese's arm around his shoulder saved his career.

Gradually the new edifice was completed and dedicated on October 22, 1911. It was a proud and happy moment for a long felt need had at last been met.

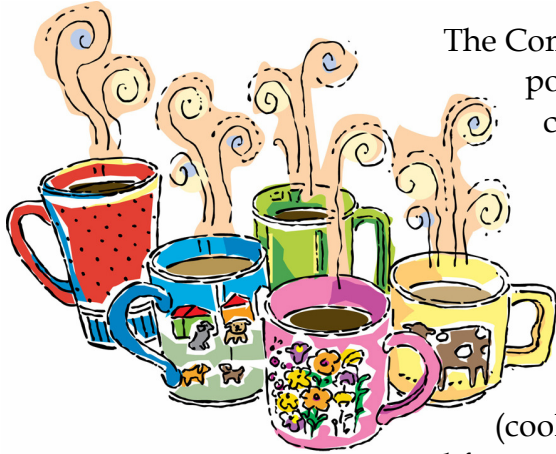
This new house of worship was built as a memorial to Clara Hall Elliott, a beloved daughter of Mr. & Mrs. Gardiner Hall, Jr. Much of the inspiration to building the church came through Miss Rosa O. Hall, whose devotion to the Willington Church and the Kingdom was instrumental in seeing the project completed. Therefore, the church is also a lasting symbol of her Christian spirit.
